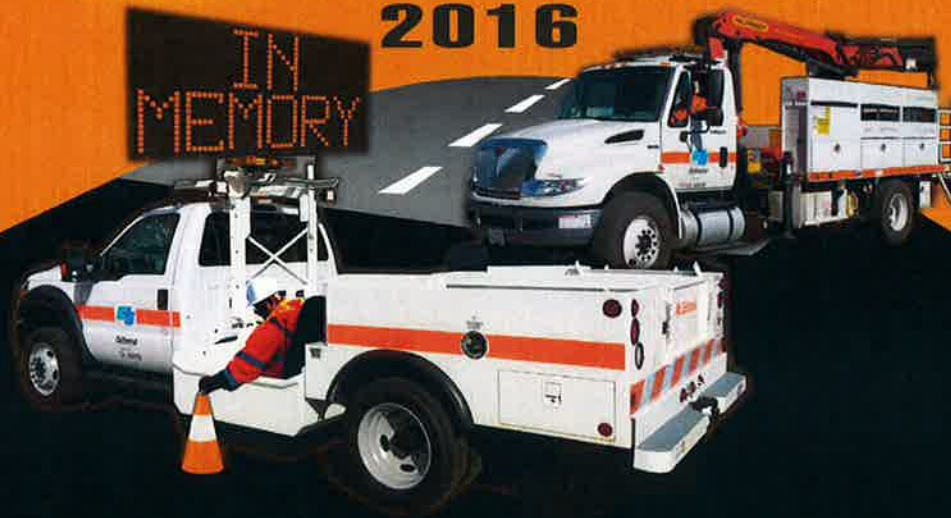

CalFresh



- The CalFresh Program is a Federal program.
- Federally known as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Helps low-income people buy the food they need for good health:
 - Raises levels of nutrition
 - Increases food purchasing power
- The program issues monthly electronic benefits that can be used to buy most foods at many markets and food stores.



CalFresh



Who can receive CalFresh benefits?

- You may be eligible to receive CalFresh benefits, whether or not you work, if you have a low income.

What is the amount of CalFresh benefits I will receive?

- For most households, CalFresh benefits are only part of their food budget.
- The maximum amount of CalFresh benefits received per month for a single adult is \$194.

Application Process

- Client Submits an Application
- County Registers and Assigns Application
- Eligibility Worker screens applicant , conducts interview
- Verification process begins ...

Program Highlights



Medi-Cal is California's Medicaid Program

- Covering low-income individuals since 1966
- Currently there are > 12 million people enrolled in California
- **1** of every 3 Californians is covered by Medi-Cal!



Program Highlights



Medi-Cal provides health care services at no or low cost to patients:

- Administered by the Dept of Healthcare Services (DHCS)
- Enrollment is managed through each California County

Who is Eligible?



Who is eligible for MediCal?

- Low-income individuals including families with children, seniors, persons with disabilities, foster children, pregnant women, and low income people with specific diseases such as tuberculosis, breast cancer or HIV/AIDS.

What are the Benefits?

- Medi-Cal currently provides a core set of health benefits, including doctor visits, hospital care, immunization, pregnancy-related services and nursing home care.
- Expanded Adult Dental Care and Behavioral Health Services




How is Eligibility Determined?




Simplified Eligibility under the ACA:

- For most applicants, eligibility is based on Current Monthly Income, Household Size, and Age of applicants
- Monthly income can be defined by the consumers' Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI) from their tax returns
- Elimination of the Asset/Property Test
- California State Residency
- U.S. Citizenship or Immigration Status

Covered California



Affordable Care Act
Created state insurance exchanges with income-based federal subsidies offered





Covered California
• Eligibility Workers help residents shop for, and enroll in, health insurance through the exchange



Safety Net to the Safety Net

Additional Programs - Limited in Use:

- County Medical Services Program (CMSP)
- General Assistance
- Emergency Assistance



County Medical Services Program

- Provides 3 months of health coverage for uninsured low-income, indigent adults that are not otherwise eligible for other publicly funded health programs
- Adults ages 21 -64
- Coverage is not considered minimum essential
- Thirty-five, primarily rural California counties participate in CMSP
- Many former CMSP enrollees are now eligible under the ACA
 - Currently under 10 enrollees in Mono County



CMSP

General Assistance (GA)

- Temporary cash assistance to legal residents of Mono County who have no other means of support
- State-mandated program, funded by Mono County
- Benefits are considered a loan




Currently 2 enrollees in Mono County

Emergency Assistance



- Immediate, short-term emergency assistance for non-residents
- General Fund expense

Examples include:

- Emergency fuel
- Motel vouchers
- Bus passes
- Food pantry and food vouchers

Managed Care Medi-Cal

- Regionalized – 19 regions
- Fee-for-Service allowed better access for enrollees

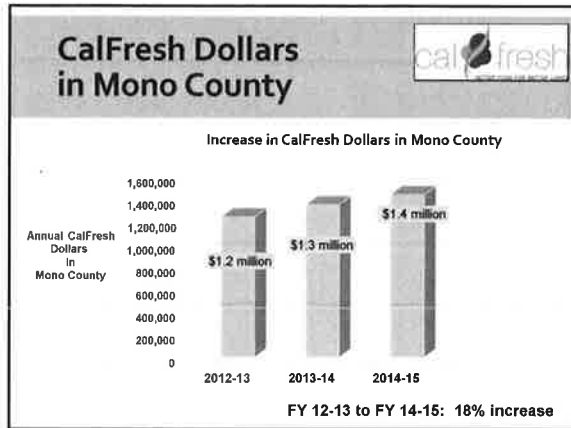


Economic Impact on Economy

- Programs largely funded with federal/state dollars, while benefits are primarily local



- Spending from programs generates economic activity locally



Economic Impact: FY 2014-15

Economic stimulus effects of CalFresh:

- Every \$5 in CalFresh benefits spent generates as much as \$9 of economic activity. *

We provide annually \$1.4 million in CalFresh benefits

- In turn, this may generate as much as \$2.5 million in annual economic activity *

RE: LADWP MANAGEMENT OF WATER RESOURCES IN MONO COUNTY

Dear Messrs. Levine and Harasick, and Ms. Edwards:

In October 2015, Mono County Supervisor Tim Alpers and I, along with County staff, met with Mr. James Yannotta and Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP) staff to discuss the need for more regular and collaborative communication. In particular, we emphasized the benefit of an early dialog and sharing of information regarding the state of the drought and its impact on the LADWP's water management decisions, particularly in Long Valley.

The Mono County Board of Supervisors is now distressed to learn via constituents, rather than the LADWP, that agricultural lessees throughout Mono County are in jeopardy of receiving reduced or no water allotments for agricultural operations. While this winter season has brought some needed drought relief, particularly in the northern portion of the state and within select watersheds statewide as evidenced by a slightly above-average spring snowpack at Mammoth Pass, we recognize the ongoing drought circumstances and the need to strategically conserve and reduce water use. We also recognize that any reductions must consider all impacts to the environment and affected parties for which the LADWP is responsible, not just those resulting from court orders and past California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) documents. These responsibilities include both agricultural lessees and habitat health for sensitive species such as the Bi-State distinct population segment of Greater Sage-grouse (Bi-State DPS).

As stated in our letter last year, the water shutoff has the potential to cause over \$6 million of lost livestock production in Mono County and \$18 million between the two counties, with substantially greater unknown impacts related to economic activity and long-term costs to rebuild herds. We understand at least some agricultural operators in Long Valley could possibly "get by" with less water for a limited time period to meet operational needs and provide habitat stewardship.


Our understanding from our Bi-State DPS conservation partners is that the Long Valley population of sage grouse has been declining steadily during the five-year drought, which is to be expected given the cyclic nature of the species' population dynamics and climatic regimes. However, the 62% decline in strutting males since 2012 emphasizes the need to support brood-rearing habitat to ensure the recruitment of chicks into the adult

population, which historically has been a very successful life stage of the Long Valley population. The water necessary to support this healthy brood-rearing habitat would also be similar in quantity and timing to the needs of Long Valley agricultural operators with the irrigation season typically starting in mid-May or as lease conditions permit.

The Mono County Board of Supervisors desires to work collaboratively with the LADWP in the same manner that we have successfully worked with other conservation partners on the Bi-State DPS. It is worth noting that the LADWP's future is undeniably entwined with the US Fish and Wildlife Service's decision not to list the Bi-State DPS, especially without a finalized Habitat Conservation Plan. We believe collaborative engagement by the LADWP supports the Department's mission and is mutually beneficial. Mono County is willing to make the substantial effort to communicate and collaborate, and again calls upon the LADWP to do the same.

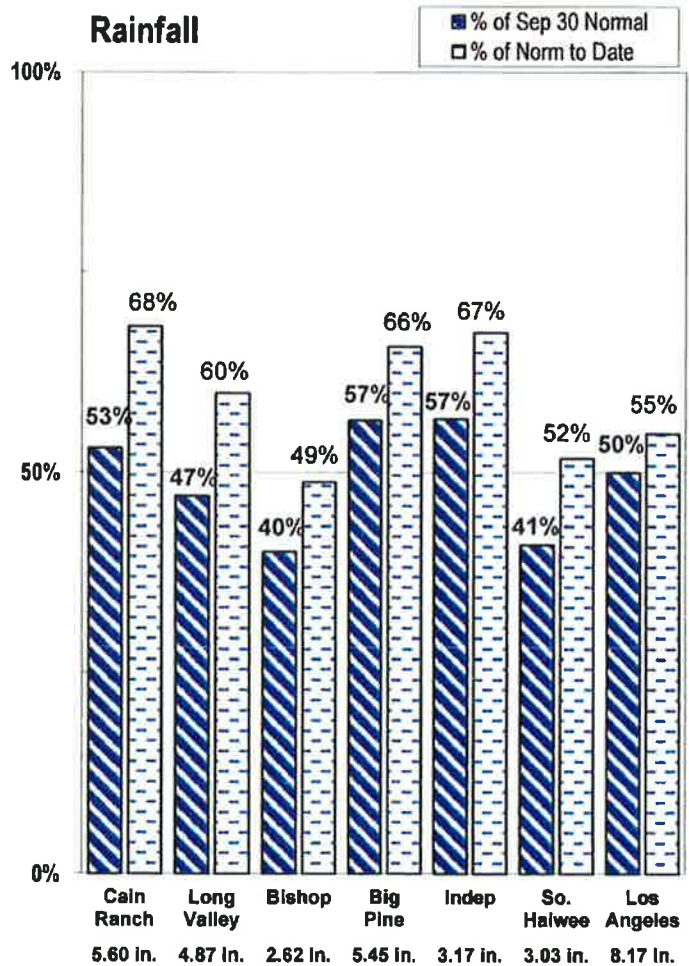
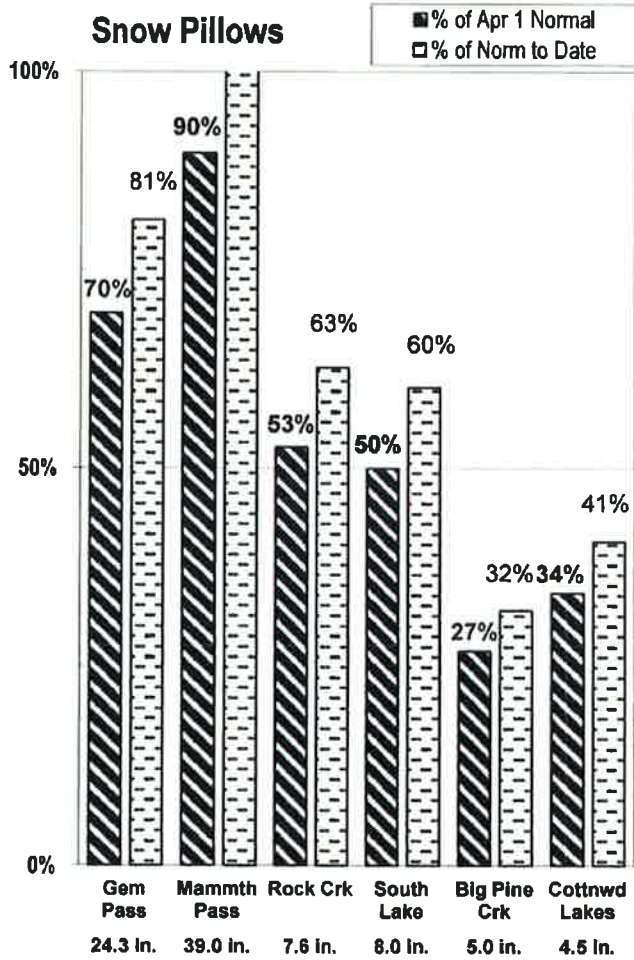
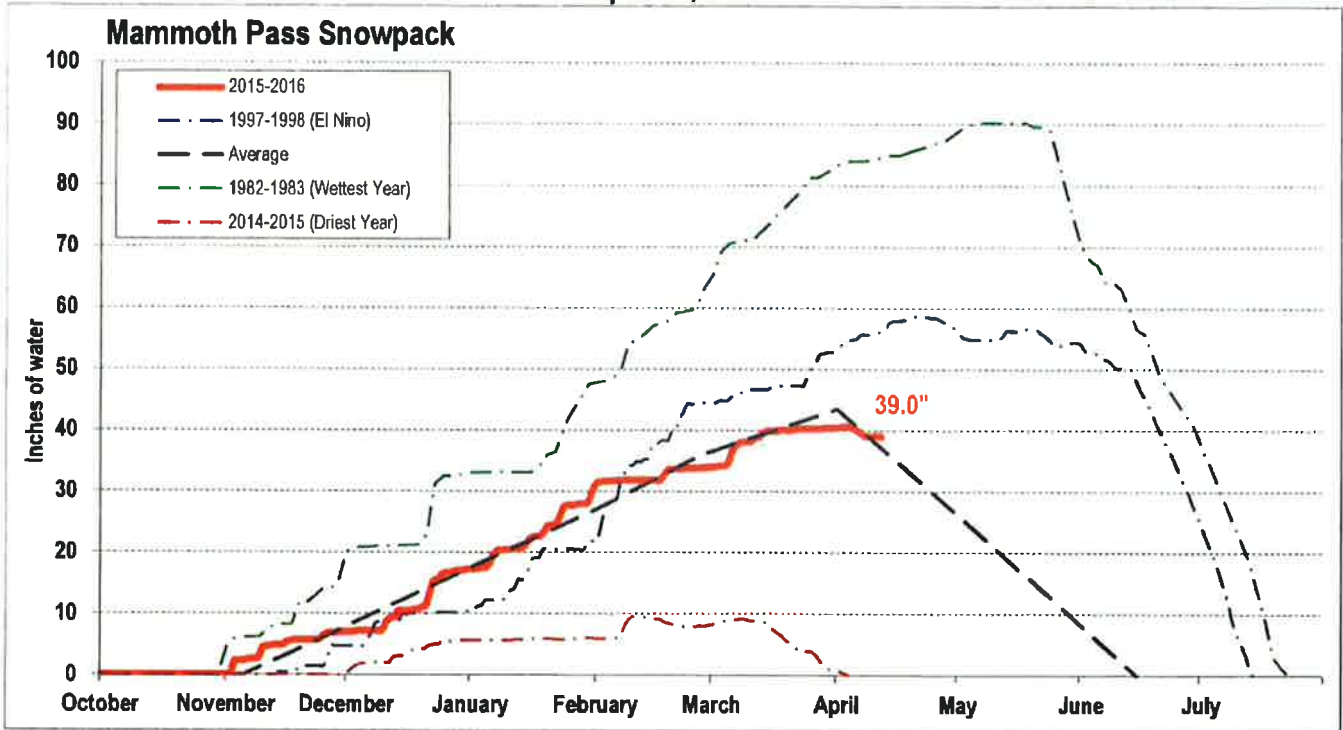
