Mono County utilizes a cloud-based, public alerting and residential safety tool that allows the Office of Emergency Management to send geo-targeted urgent alerts to subscribers. Residents and visitors are encouraged to visit <u>READY Mono</u> to subscribe to the emergency alert system in advance of the test on October 7th.
